WHICH NBME SELF-ASSESSMENT FORMS ARE CHANGING, AND WHEN?

Updated forms to help you prepare for your exams will be available on **March 24, 2021**.

Along with providing answer explanations across the entire Self-Assessment offering, we're introducing the following updated forms:

- ▶ 6 updated Comprehensive Basic Science Self-Assessment forms will be introduced, and 6 forms will be retired.
 - ▶ Updated form numbers: 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, and 30
 - ▶ Retired form numbers: 18, 20, 21, 22, 23, and 24

The old forms aren't going anywhere just yet. You can purchase retired forms before March 24, 2021 and continue to access them for 90 days.

If you've already purchased, but not yet started forms 18, 20, 21, 22, 23, and 24, you can change forms when choosing an exam to take at [MyNBMESM Examinee Portal](#).

Revisions to Comprehensive Basic Science Self-Assessments

- ▶ On March 24, 2021, NBME's Comprehensive Basic Science Self Assessments will be revised to align with August 2020 amendments to the USMLE Step 1 Exam—now including questions on assessing communication skills to expand assessments of soft competencies.
